1. Paul classifies scripture into four categories (2Tim 3:16)
a. Doctrine (pointing out a t)
b. Reproof (pointing out a s)
c. Correction (pointing out the right way to l)
d. Training in righteousness (what is needed to g)
2. Let us use Rom 13:1-3 as an example

- a. Doctrine All government is ordained by God (v. 1)
- b. Training I must subject myself to the government I am under since God ordained it (v. 1)
- c. Reproof Do not oppose governmental authority (v. 2)

d. Correction – Do what is good (v. 3)

•The act of admonishing each other
1. Requires mildness - If you find yourself being h in correcting other believers,
you are not admonishing but condemning.
2. Requires using God's w you don't have to know more than the person
being admonished
3. Is needed because we are im
